



Facility Survey/Audit

This comprehensive survey is designed to identify areas in and around the building that could potentially impact human health and the environment. A completed survey will serve as a blueprint for designing recommendations to improve Green Cleaning.

Green Cleaning takes a wholistic approach to building maintenance, recognizing that many facets of building operations can impact cleanliness and human health. The survey may review areas that are out of scope of normal cleaning, but they still need to be inspected.

Tip: The conditions outside the building can have a direct impact on conditions inside. Damaged building exteriors can be an entry point for insects and rodents. Dirty sidewalks and parking lots will undoubtedly result in more dirt entering the building. By identifying these issues they can be appropriately addressed in the green facility plan.

Tip: It would not be expected that those responsible for cleaning a facility would inspect the roof. However, it is good to be aware of known leaks as these can be sources of pest intrusion and mold growth if left unchecked.

Tip: An effective matting program is key in stopping many contaminants that could enter a building. It is often recommended to have 15-20 feet of an effective matting system (scraper, scraper/wiper, wiper) at entryways to stop up to 80% of the dirt entering the building. Proper maintenance outside the building entrances such as regular sweeping are also important.

Tip: The condition of areas the public sees are important as they effect image. In addition, high touch surfaces must be cleaned frequently to keep building occupants healthy. On hard floors, rub a piece of white paper on the floor to get an idea of the level of dirt on the floor. Waste receptacles must be cleaned and maintained regularly to avoid growth of bacteria and attracting rodents.

Tip: Below ground areas can be a source for many indoor air quality problems. These areas are a collection point for moisture and can be a breeding ground for mold, mildew, insects, and other pests. Look for standing water or visible mold growth.

Tip: The HVAC (Heating, Ventilation and Cooling) System plays a huge role in IAQ by properly filtering out contaminants and regular exchanging of air to bring in fresh air. The system must be maintained at peak operating efficiency with scheduled filter changes and inspections.

Tip: Garages and loading docks can be a source of carbon monoxide and exhaust odors from running vehicles and also from gasoline and propane powered equipment. The indoor environment must be sealed off from intrusion of these odors. Check doors for proper seals and insure vents do not draw air into the building.

Tip: Make sure there is proper storage, separation and labeling of chemicals, petroleum solvents, gasoline, oil and pesticides. Make sure all cleaning chemicals are properly labeled, particularly secondary use containers for diluted concentrates.

Tip: These areas can become breeding grounds for bacteria if not regularly and properly cleaned. Employee areas can be particularly challenging when food is consumed and disposed of at work stations.

Tip: Food areas can be a breeding ground for bacteria and must be thoroughly evaluated and appropriate sanitation procedures implemented. Floor drains are often a source of foul odors in food service areas. Use of a biological drain treatment may be warranted. Also, examine how garbage is maintained and disposed. Use of a biological odor treatment may be warranted here as well. Make note of the flooring type as porous grouted floors can become easily soiled without proper cleaning.

Tip: This area requires special attention due to the presence of pathogens that can impact human health. Look for grouted floors that are heavily discolored as evidence of poor cleaning methods. Hard water rings in toilets or scale buildup around fixtures is a common problem that can be addressed with proper cleaning.
